Emergency Relief

Communication

In the last year we facilitate training in Disaster Response to over 2000 professionals worldwide.

Mother Helpage worldwide has set up a Disaster Consultancy in order to provide a quality and the professional relief service during disasters.

POST DISASTER ECONOMIC SUSTAINABILITY

Post Disaster Counselling

Following a catastrophic disaster, brief psychological intervention has proven to reduce disaster related distress. MHW aims to provide victims with a channel to ventilate their feelings, normalise responses in victims, educate, support and reduce isolation through the promotion of group, panel and community counselling.

MHW provides counselling to the victims of disaster in order to provide them with the mental stability to withstand the implications of disaster. We aim to ensure that the community becomes resilient and self-sufficient after facing the consequences of disaster.

Post Disaster Rehabilitation

Planning and management of settlements, re-establishing livelihoods and basic services for vulnerable groups are key priorities for Mother Helpage Worldwide.

Emergency shelter proved to be the primary need in the postdisaster phase, but the delivery of the shelter needs for diverse communities proved challenging. MHW plan to undertake the long term shelter strategies to sustain the basic needs of communities with considerations of religion, culture and educational requirements.

MHW ensures that the affected community attains the quality of becoming self-sufficient.





We have launched our corporate division INFINITE in 2012. Achievements include the setting up of small to medium scale factories for the following groups:

- Vocational Training Centre / factory for disaster victims in Kashmir
- Ice Cream manufacturing units for Tsunami victims in Indonesia
- Fair Trade Tea processing plant for Tsunami victims in Sri Lanka

Women Empowerment projects proved popular and MHW are proud to announce the success in setting up industries for women in disaster regions within Asia.

Promoting sustainable income resources through entrepreneurship schemes. 2012 saw the setting up of Poultry & Cattle raring farms and agricultural farms in various countries.

ROAD RECONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

MHW have committed to ensure road safety by reconstructing and tendering for new roads within and around disaster regions around the world.

POST DISASTER MEDICAL CARE

In the aftermath of any natural and complex disaster there is an increase in mortality and morbidity due to communicable diseases. Epidemics can occur and are often caused by inadequate water supplies, poor sanitation and overcrowding. Public health surveillance systems are important for detecting, tracking, and controlling such situations.

MHW deployed physicians and other health professionals to the affected area to provide medical services.

MHW donated high tec surgical instruments to a number of hospitals within disaster struck zones around the world. We delivered, installed and provided training on the use of the specialised equipment.

We supplied medicines and latest vaccines to a number of hospitals within disaster areas which were recognised as high risk / priority around the world.

We have set up camp hospitals at the Syrian border to provide medical services to the refugees.













POST DISASTER CARE FOR SPECIAL CHILDREN

Projects for Special Children

There are tens of millions of children around the globe living without parents, working in hazardous conditions, sold into trafficking, forced to drug addiction, militancy and there is a long list of corruption towards these innocent souls. Mother Helpage Worldwide through its programs for these special children has so far succeeded in securing the lives of hundreds of such children who were vulnerable to the murky clouds of opportunism.

The process of post disaster rehabilitation often assumes adequate living serves everyone similarly. However, MHW recognises the needs of children according to gender, age culture, religion, stage of development. The impact of disaster disrupts young lives and can compromise the following areas at the very least, leaving children vulnerable:

- Health & Safety
- Emotional Security and stability
- Mental development
- Social growth
- Identity
- Care





We believe that children's participation is imperative and should be built into the broader community process – We aim to support strong family and community relationships through protecting and nurturing the young.



Mother Helpage Worldwide is the only disaster response charity who has constructed disaster resilient orphanages and schools around the world. These establishments withstand earthquakes, flooding etc. MHW has introduced a compulsory subject, teaching children about disaster response and prepares them to play a valuable and rewarding role during and after disaster.

Post tsumani in Indonesia saw the launch of a disaster resilient school for disabled children. This work could not have been realised without the generous financial assistance from Alwaleed Bin Talal Foundation and the on ground support of Muslim Hands.





SPONSORSHIP SCHEME

Sponsorship and support of special children (without parents)

We are currently sponsoring more than 1000 orphans directly and more than 5000 via other supportive procedures.

Student Sponsorship

We support disadvantaged children in completing their education

Sports academies in the UK, Africa and Kashmir

To develop the skills in young people with a view to encourage leadership and patrons for the future.

Karimia FC is a football club based in Nottingham. We currently couch 30 local youths to semi-professional level. We have trained mentors and the club is steadily growing.

Family Sponsorship

MHW provide disadvantaged families with income generating sources , such as a milking cow, poultry farm, apiary farm to produce honey, Ice-cream production kit and sewing machines.

Community Centres and Mosques

Mother Helpage brings communities together through the facilitation of Community Centres and Mosques. We believe in community cohesion and harmony – we have constructed 10 mosques worldwide and our latest project took the team to Nepal where we built Masid-e-Muhammad (PBUH).

POST DISASTER WATER AID

Global Water Aid

MHW set out to provide safe, clean water to the world's poorest people.

We have installed over 8000 water wells in a number of countries including Nigeria, Somalia, Sudan, Kashmir, Gujarat and Pakistan.

YOUTH DEVELOPMENT

Investing in our youth is critical in global development. MHW recognizes that youth of today are important assets for the economic, political and social life of their communities.

We have found that young women face challenges in developing countries. Generally, females in these countries receive less education than their male counterparts – the females marry young and have fewer economic opportunities.



MOTHER HELPAGE WORLDWIDE EMPOWER WOMEN

"YOU MUST FEEL EMPOWERED AND THAT IS EXACTLY WHAT THE MHW HAS DONE FOR ME. I AM HIGHLY OBLIGED"

Tanveera, 36, from a family where women are not allowed to venture out, skilled in the art weaving Shahtoosh, Tanveera earned around Rs 200 every day (Shahtoosh - a fine fabric used to make delicate shawls that are skilfully passed through a ring. Manufacture, sale and purchase of the fine fabric was banned in 1997. Around half a million people involved with the trade were rendered jobless) - the ban shattered Tanveera and many like her. However, she got married but things only worsened for her.

After hearing about her story, Mother Helpage Worldwide approached Tanveera, proposing a position which would not only utilise her passion but will empower both her and other women through skills transfer and training – she is currently working as Assistant Instructor at our centre. The process of learning and teaching has done wonders to her physiology and psychology. She is a changed person and earns her livelihood. According to Tanveera, empowerment does not lie only in earning money. "You must feel empowered and that is exactly what the MHW has done for me. I am highly obliged", she said.

We believe that women are as important as anybody else and that they cannot be confined to four walls of a house. The process of making a woman involves a number of measures starting with making them believe that they are human beings having rights and privileges. She is not a machine for procuring children and she is not meant for household jobs exclusively.

A woman's right to education has been recognized by the most revered Prophet (SAW). The Holy Quran urges Muslims to go for research, to explore the skies and the oceans, to see what earth has in its bosom. Therefore, can anybody lock women in a room? A Muslim woman has a right to negotiate the terms and conditions of her marriage. This is the level of empowerment that Islam has laid down for women. And when the Divine Law supports, advocates and promotes it; there is no room left for patriarchy.

Mother Helpage Worldwide perceives women empowerment holistically. A woman, MHW believes, does not have to take off her clothes to feel empowered. She does not have to dress like men to display her level of empowerment. Empowerment can be achieved in a modest dress as well.

MHW launched the women empowerment programme in June 2012 opening a Vocational Training Centre in Sidiqabad area of Srinagar, Kashmir. Besides a monthly stipend of Rs 500, each trainee receives free tools, raw material, medicare and counselling. The centre completed its term in February this year and by the grace of Allah the almighty, we have been able to change many lives. The graduate embroiders, makes pillow covers, bed covers and a variety of articles ranging from handbags to Musallahs (prayer mats). The CEO (MHW) has ordered Musallahs for distribution before the Holy Month of Ramadhan. "The feeling is really good. We are making something to be sold in Europe", said a student. This is where the empowerment lies.






FUTURE WORK


